Kristi Vetter, BJSHS Band Teacher, Elyse Krier, Grace Marozas, Lizzie Overmiller and Autumn Sneath gave a presentation on their trip to San Antonio, Texas on March 21-22, 2018. Mrs. Vetter reported that it costs \$520 per person for the trip.

A motion was made by Budke, seconded by S. Odle, to approve the band trip to San Antonio, TX. Motion carried: 6 Yeas, 0 Nays.

A motion was made by T. Odle, seconded by File, to approve the Little Red Schoolhouse Partnership Contract. Motion carried: 6 Yeas, 0 Nays.
