They handed out a draft letter regarding the next step for the renovation process and an updated proposal. Copies are attached. They want to establish an Operations Committee and asked if there was interest of one or two board members serving on the committee. Mr.

Travis said that he would volunteer to be on the committee along with one board member. Mr. Boettcher said that they would get the committee together in the next two or three weeks.

The superintendent reported on: Beloit Elementary and Jr.-Sr. High School Food Drive; KESA/Gemini Report; Coffee Group; Ten Passenger Vans; Summer School Enrichment Donation of \$2,000 from North Central Kansas Regional Planning Commission and \$10,000 from Don Kincaid, DS Bus Company (this money will be deposited in the USD273 Foundation Fund) and Sharra Odle was given an award from KASB in recognition for attending training programs.

It was the consensus of the board to schedule a planning session for Monday, December 11, 2017 from 5:30 p.m. to 6:30 p.m.

A motion was made by S. Odle, seconded by Budke, to approve the appointment of Mindy Hilt as Deputy Clerk of the Board. Motion carried: 7 Yeas, 0 Nays.

A motion was made by Riemann, seconded by Budke, to approve Terri Engelbert as an assistant junior high girl's basketball coach. Motion carried: 7 Yeas, 0 Nays.
