The Superintendent informed the Board that a committee consisting of Amber Krier, Cassie Kopsa, Rex Boley, Jeff Travis and Tiffany Schroeder interviewed two candidates for Special Education Director position. After being interviewed by the committee, the candidates met by zoom with Karen Niemczyk. The candidates were from two different spectrums – one would be a first year director and the other has had years of experience. The committee and Mrs. Niemczyk decided to offer the position to Christie Gerdes and she accepted. The Superintendent hopes to have a meet and greet for the board members to meet Mrs. Gerdes. The Superintendent discussed the ACTE conference he and a few other employees attended. He said it was one of the best conferences he has attended. News last week from KSDE stated it looks like there could be a 7.94 million dollar increase in funds for FY23 and a four million dollar increase for FY24. They believe cash balances will continue to increase. KSDE is anticipating putting \$72 million into the Special Education budget over the next 5 years. This means that there could be \$75,000 – \$80,000 in excess cost the district would not have to pay into special education.

A motion was made by File, seconded by Thompson, to approve the hiring of Christie Gerdes as Special Education Director for the 2022-23 school year and extend to the 2024-2025 school year. Motion carried: 6 Yeas, 0 Nays.

A motion was made by Stillwell, seconded by Thompson, to approve sending the policy books to KASB to review, give revisions to School Attorney, Jim Johnson, for him to go through and go over with the Board. Mr. Travis will give the board 60 days to go over the board policies then bring them back to the board for approval. Motion carried: 6 Yeas, 0 Nays.

Thompson moved that the Board of Education go into executive session at 7:17 P.M. for the purpose of discussing matters relating to actions adversely or favorably affecting a person as a student because if this matter were discussed in open session it might invade the privacy of those discussed and that the Board of Education reconvene into open session at 7:27 P.M. in this room with Jeff Travis and Casey Seyfert remaining. The motion was seconded by Adams. Motion carried: 6 Yeas, 0 Nays.

The meeting reconvened into open session at 7:27 P.M.

Thompson moved that the Board of Education go into executive session at 7:28 P.M. for the purpose of discussing personnel matters on non-elected personnel and their contractual obligations because if this matter were discussed in open session it might invade the privacy of those discussed and that the Board of Education reconvene into open session at 7:43 P.M. in this room with Jeff Travis and Brady Dean remaining. The motion was seconded by Krier. Motion carried: 6 Yeas, 0 Nays.
