Resurfacing of the high school parking was discussed. Summer projects were discussed by the Superintendent. The HTK Architects advised that the BES sewer needs replaced very soon. The Superintendent needs to meet with the Network Administrators to discuss the technology needs. This will be brought back for discussion next month. The BES marquee was discussed. The BES PTO has raised \$17,000 of the \$27,000 needed to purchase the marquee. The district's OVT visit is scheduled for April 28, 2022 at 9:00 AM. Kubota visited the district last week. They would like to develop a training center in Beloit.
