A motion was made by S. Odle, seconded by Budke, to approve updates to Policy GBRJ-R Arrangements for Substitutes. With this motion, the rate of pay for certified substitutes will go from \$80.00 per day to \$85.00 per day for five or less consecutive days and from \$95.00 to \$100.00 per day for six or more consecutive days. The rate of pay for substitutes for non-certified staff will go from \$8.50 per hour to \$8.75 per hour. Motion carried: 7 Yeas, 0 Nays.
