A motion was made by Budke, seconded by Riemann, to approve the classified staff recommendations for 2017-2018, as presented by the administration. Motion carried: 6 Yeas, 0 Nays.

A motion was made by Shamburg, seconded by Budke, to approve a contract with Southeast Kansas Education Service Center for FY18. Motion carried: 6 Yeas, 0 Nays.

A motion was made by T. Odle, seconded by Shamburg, to approve a two year contract with Stephanie Meier Photography and Cole W. Eberle Photography for elementary and jr-sr high school pictures. Motion carried: 6 Yeas, 0 Nays.

A motion was made by Riemann, seconded by Budke, to approve a ten cent increase in student lunches for the 2017-2018 school year. Motion carried: 6 Yeas, 0 Nays.
